CREATIVE DESIGN CHALLENGE


SEP 14 - DEC 14 2018 (12 WEEK)







SEPTEMBER 16 - DECEMBER 16 (14 WEEK) SUNDAY, 1:30 - 4:30PM



3D DESIGN FUNDAMENTAL


SEPTEMBER 11 - DECEMBER 14 (14 WEEK) TUESDAY - FRIDAY. 4:00 - 7:00PM

It also provides further insight to an individual student's personality, creativity, styles, as well as strengths and weaknesses.
